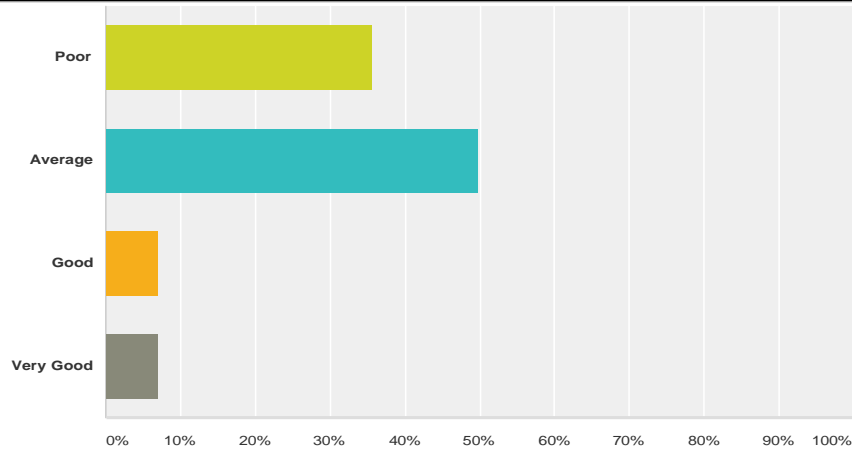
5. The printouts and the slides were too small to read or see clearly. The class needs to be tailored more toward the needs of appraisers in understanding features and quality of a home from the blueprint.

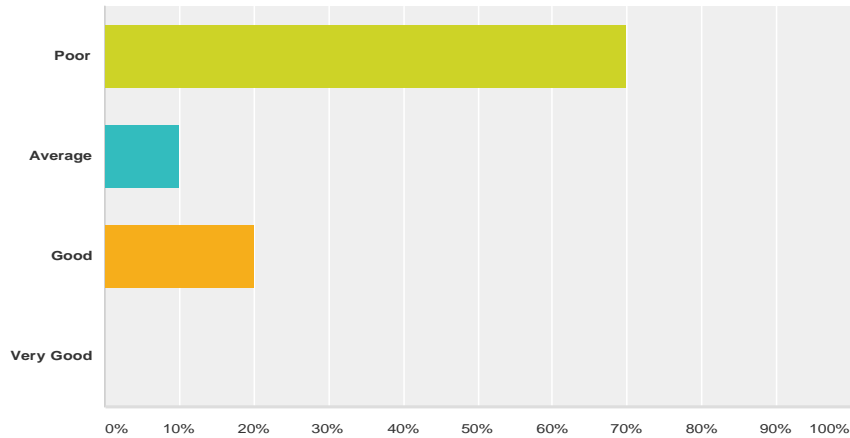
Understanding Conservation Easements - Good class, very detailed, good reference material, good explanations.
